PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Finally, spring is here! With the warm weather here to stay, we are very busy at Buckley School. With many activities that take place in school and outside of school, we are asking that you continue to emphasize to you children that there is a great deal of learning that will continue these next two months. We have high expectations for our students, just like at the start of the school year. Demonstrating consistent effort, hard work and appropriate behavior is critical, allowing students to end the year on a positive note. Please note that during the month of May, students in grades 1-5 will be taking the **NWEA** benchmark testing.

As the year comes to a close, we begin to plan for the next school year. One of our major tasks is the development of class lists. As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, please understand that this is a carefully thought out process, with the lists being created by the current year's teacher along with supporting staff including our social worker, school psychologist, our literacy and numeracy coach, accompanied by input and discussion with the principal and receiving teachers. A great deal of time is spent considering many factors to make the right decision for each child. Our ultimate goal is to provide your child with their best placement. With this in mind, please know that we will make the ultimate decision as to class placement. Thank you for your understanding. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me at school.

I would like to draw your attention to my letter, located in this newsletter, regarding dropping off and picking up your child from school. Please take the time to read this as it is very important in maintaining a safe environment in our parking lots.

In addition, I would also like to remind everyone of our procedures when visiting Buckley. Please stop in the main office to sign in and to receive a Visitor's badge. Thank you!

Finally, I would like to remind everyone of our safety procedures that we have at school. As the year winds down and we are holding many activities, I believe this is an ideal time to remind everyone of our safety procedures.

- When picking up your child you may be asked to present identification. Please note that this is for the safety of your child.

KINDERGARTEN

We have certainly seen our share of April showers this month and are excited to move into the month of May. We have been very busy writers this month, writing our "How to" books. In math, we started to learn about shapes. We have been naming shapes, counting the sides and vertices, and also drawing them. May will be another busy month for us. The themes that we will be visiting include, butterflies, barnyard animals, and flowers. In preparation for first grade the children have started to practice writing their first and last names. We are working hard at using uppercase and lowercase letters appropriately. Enjoy the springtime weather!

FIRST GRADE

It is hard to believe that May is here. It has been a very busy year. All students in First Grade have been writing opinion pieces. Keep up all the reading you have been doing at home. You are doing a great job! Our students have come a long way since September! In math we have been focusing on all of our geometric shapes. Please continue to practice your math facts! Students need to be confident with their basic addition and subtraction math skills. In science we wrapped up our weather unit and have moved onto plants. We are also looking forward to meeting our VIP, Very Important People, in June. Look for more information on this wonderful activity in the coming weeks. See you soon!

SECOND GRADE

In April, the second grade students have been continuing their hard work and determination in challenging their thinking! Our students have truly "blown us away" with their abilities as the curriculum progressively becomes more challenging.

In reading, the students have continued their work with informational texts, as they have learned all about nonfiction text features. The students have examined a variety of books which contain a table of contents, glossary, index, bold words, labels, diagrams, and more! This has aided students in incorporating these components into their own informational writing. The students have also continued their work with identifying the main idea of a passage along with supporting details. When reading with your child, you may ask if they can identify the main idea/topic of a given passage. This will enhance their overall reading comprehension!

In math, the students have worked on measuring objects using a variety of units and tools. This was a fun-filled unit as the students were able to apply their knowledge of measurement through hands-on exploration! The students have also begun representing and analyzing data through using line plots, data tables, bar graphs, and pictographs! Please continue encouraging your child to practice his or her basic math facts to improve speed and accuracy. The students have been utilizing the interactive computer program Fastt Math to practice this skill and have truly shown progress!

In writing, the students have been working on the publishing process as they edit and revise their written work during our Writer's Workshop. The students are continuing their informational pieces and will be moving into reading and writing poetry.

This month, the students have been looking forward to their field trip to the Connecticut Science Center! The Buckley Elementary School P.T.A. was very generous in funding the cost of our whole trip! We are very grateful to have such a wonderful sense of community within our school! We hope you enjoyed your April Vacation, and thank you again for all of your continued supports.

THIRD GRADE

We look forward to seeing everyone at VIP day! In Math, we are still plowing through fractions. By the end of the unit students will be able to identify fractions with number lines, words, equivalent fractions, and pictures. Students will be able to compare fractions with either like denominators or like numerators. Students will be able to locate the numerator and denominator in a fraction and be able to tell what its function is. Students will also be able to solve word problems using fractions. It's a gigantic unit and it will be good to finally move onto Time, Geometry, and Measurement.

In Writing and in Reading, we are continuing to work on Persuasive/Opinion pieces. Ask your child about the PET, SPY or BEAR strategy! You can help at home by reading an article from the newspaper and asking your child's opinion on the matter. Right now, Manchester is closing its homeless shelter. There have been 5-6 articles about it in both The Hartford Courant and the Journal Inquirer. Both papers are online. After reading these articles, students could decide whether they agree with MACC's decision to close the shelter, or whether they disagree with the decision and they should be able to state at least three reasons why they feel this way.

Third grade will be doing a lot of testing in May. We have SBAC testing for five days, and 2-3 days of testing for the NWEA. Please try and not schedule appointments during the month of May as it is really hard to make up tests, and it further takes away from their instruction.

Our Field Trips are coming up soon. We are going to tour Manchester with the Manchester Historical Society on June 1 and we are also going to the CT Science Center on June 3rd. We could use parents on both trips so please consider chaperoning!!!!

FOURTH GRADE

Hooray for May! After months of learning about US Geography, each of the fourth grade students will get to choose a state and begin working on the year's culminating research project. Our final ELA unit requires students to synthesize information across diverse texts, critique texts with analytical lenses and share research. Once the research is completed, the children will have the opportunity to present what they have learned to an audience. The expectation is that over time your child will be able to hold an audience's attention with the use of direct eye contact, fluctuation of volume and inflection, and a solid command of the information they have found. We will have a "State Fair" during the last week of school.

There are two more units of study in math. We will begin the measurement unit in May followed by geometry in June. The children will solve problems involving measurement and conversion of measurements. They must know relative sizes of measurement units including km, m, cm; kg, g; lb, oz.; l, ml; hr, min, sec., express measurements in a larger unit in terms of a smaller unit, and record measurement equivalents in a two-column table. They will use the four operations to solve word problems involving distances, intervals of time, liquid volumes, masses of objects, and money.

We are looking forward to our field trip to Earle Park in Glastonbury on May 5th. This trip aligns with our current science unit, Land and Water. Look for this permission slip and a waiver required by the Audubon Society to come home soon!

FIFTH GRADE

We are looking forward to our trip to Sturbridge Village, furthering our understanding of life long ago. This will be a nice culminating activity to enhance our study of colonial life and professions. We will have an opportunity to witness many of these talented craftsmen's work firsthand.

On May 18th, the Buckley 5th graders will be taken to Bennet Academy for a quick tour. This is a chance to introduce the students to the faculty and principal of the school, and also to walk through parts of the building. It is an exciting time for us, and will help to answer some of the questions and concerns of the children. This will be for students only. Parents will have an opportunity to visit Bennet on a different date.

Although there has been a lot of talk about sixth grade and many of us are already thinking about next year, there is still a considerable amount of learning, review work, and testing to be done here at Buckley. We need everyone to remain focused and on task for the remainder of the school year. Keeping our students "in the moment" will help prepare them for tomorrow.

COACHES CORNER

Spring is a wonderful time of year to think about Math! Students can use mathematics as they incorporate Science and begin planting spring flowers. There are numerous opportunities to think about measuring, fractions, spatial relations and even geometry. Planning a garden and taking care of the plants/vegetables is a wonderful way to connect Math, Science and Family Fun. Be sure to measure the growth often to work on measurement and comparison skills.

It is very important that all students continue to practice their basic math facts in order to build fact fluency. What a fun thing to do while taking a long walk or bike ride. All grades have worked so hard this year on their fact fluency and should continue to throughout the springtime and the summer in order to build their automaticity. Enjoy the warmer weather!

MAP

This month we continued with our spring theme. We made bunnies out of foam and butterflies out of coffee filters. We read Mouse's First Spring by Lauren Thompson and Angelina and the Butterfly by Katharine Holabird. We added a new song to our circle activities called "10 Little Butterflies" to go with our butterfly theme. We are having a lot of fun at recess in the warm spring sunshine! We will start our summer theme in June.

The end of the school year is quickly approaching. Field day has been scheduled for June 5th with a rain date of June 10th. Grade levels will be assigned color t-shirts to wear in the upcoming weeks. All students will receive a flyer to bring home outlining their t-shirt color, what to wear for field day, and also the time of their scheduled field day. Parents and family members are encouraged to attend to show support for their children.

Grades 3-5 are involved in a floor hockey unit at this time. The students are learning how to stick handle, how to shoot, how to pass and they are also being educated on the rules of floor hockey. Students in kindergarten through 2nd grade are participating in parachute activities. As the weather becomes nicer, we will start to have PE class outdoors. Students can wear hats to keep the sun off of them if need be! Happy Spring!

Dear Parent/Guardians,

As you know, we have specific procedures to dropping off and picking up your child. The purpose of this letter is to remind everyone of these procedures and alert you to a necessary change.

In order to alleviate some traffic issues in the front, I suggest that, if your child is in grades 3-5, utilize the back parking lot via Barry Road for both drop-offs and pick-ups. As a guide for the back parking lot area off Barry Road, please follow the protocol outlined below:

- **Please park on the right hand side.** When entering the parking lot, please pull all the way down. After picking up your child, please follow the parking lot and make a loop to turn around and exit the parking lot. Please drive slowly and watch for children.

If your child is in grades K-2, I am asking that you utilize the front of the building specifically, the circle for drop-off and pick-up. Please remember not to double park your car in the circle during the morning or afternoon. Due to an increase in the number of parents/guardians picking their child up in this circle, **I am asking that if there are no spots available, please do not continue to move around the circle as this is dangerous with students getting into cars.** Instead, please use the parking lot in the back of the building or off Barry Road. Please continue to use the protocol outlined below:

- If you are using the circle to drop off or pick up your child, please drive slowly and park on the right hand side of the circle.
- Please **DO NOT** stop in the middle of the circle to drop-off your child. This creates a traffic jam and is unsafe for our children. Also, please do not park on the inside of the circle
- Please walk your children to and from the building after parking your car.

 - ✓ If the parking lot is full off Barry Road, you may use the available parking located in the back/side of the building where our faculty parks. There are several available spaces.
 - ✓ You may use the circle if there are spots available. Please do not park on the inner side of the circle.
- Lastly, listed below is the schedule that we will use for our **V.I.P.** visitors. Please make sure you familiarize yourselves with this schedule. Our teachers are currently busy planning exciting events for you!
