- Buckley staff has implemented best practices specific to instruction in a variety of areas including writer's and reader's workshop and math workshop model (small group instruction) as well as continuing our practice of Professional Learning Communities. In our Professional Learning Community meetings, we discuss our teaching practice, analyze our curriculum and look at student progress.
- We continue to implement curricular units aligned to the common core.
- We are working with LitLife consultants, a leader in literacy instruction, in order to improve our literacy instruction.
- We continue to incorporate more technology into our classrooms. Specifically, our fifth graders are 1:1 with their technology.
- We are partnering with our Family resource Center (FRC) in order to connect school and home.

In addition, please know that we are currently making adjustments and incorporating more best practices to this document. We will incorporate this into our document and share this with staff at our August back to school meetings.

We have been talking about the weather. Each day we discuss the weather and have been keeping track of it on a graph. In math we completed our unit on addition and subtraction and started our unit on teen numbers. We will continue with this unit in April. In Language Arts our focus has been on non-fiction books. We have been reading stories about spring and learning about living and non-living things. We have been working very hard on our writing and starting to identify sight words in different stories that we are reading. April will be another fun-filled month for us. We will be planting flowers and watching them grow. Keep practicing the kindergarten sight words; this will help your child continue to grow as a reader and writer. Happy Spring!

## **FIRST GRADE** Ms. Seaha & Mrs. Bourcier

March was a very busy month for our fabulous first graders! We enjoyed seeing all of the parents at conferences. It gave us a wonderful opportunity to discuss the growth and progress that your children have made during the second marking period. The first graders enjoyed reading and discussing all of the amazing books by Dr. Seuss during our celebration of "Read Across America." Thank you to all of the fabulous guest readers who took the time to come in and share a favorite book with our classes!

During the month of April we will continue to work on building reading fluency and comprehension. In math we will practice our problem solving strategies and begin to explore place value. Please continue to practice your addition and subtraction facts at home. Knowledge of these facts will help your child find success in many other areas of math!

Many of the first graders have been working on writing and illustrating their own stories. These stories will be getting published very soon. Look for more information about purchasing copies of your child's original work! Thank you for all of your support throughout the year!

## **SECOND GRADE** Mrs. Strickland, Ms. Marocchini & Miss Riley

In April, the second grade students have been continuing their hard work and determination in challenging their thinking! Our students have "blown us away" with their abilities as the curriculum progressively becomes more challenging.

In reading, the students are finishing up their work with book series. They have developed ideas about characters with their book club partners. They have been amazed at what they can learn about a character across a book series. Using evidence from the text, students pick out character traits from a variety of books. Coming up, we will be starting a new unit! The focus of the unit will be on author's message. We will be reading lots of books of fairytales, fables, and folktales. This is a great unit to end the year with!

In math, we are in the middle of our unit working with three-digit numbers. With a focus on place value, students have been representing numbers with words and pictures. Using a variety of different math centers, we can practice comparing and ordering numbers. Students also show their math thinking multiple ways when adding and subtracting three-digit numbers. Your child continues to make strides improving their math fact fluency using FastMath.

In writing, the students have just begun a unit on opinion writing. We are focusing on developing opinions about books we are reading. We have shown them many ways to develop their

own opinions using at least 3 supporting reasons, and they love to share those with their classmates. All second graders have an opinion about something!

The end of the year is fast approaching but we still have a lot of fun learning planned! Outside of the classroom, we have an all school assembly with a special music guest the kids are sure to love. We hope you enjoy your April vacation, and thank you again for all the continued supports.

## **THIRD GRADE** Mr. Sweetland & Ms. Brown

We will be writing our opinions in our Lucy Calkins unit on Persuasive Writing. We will soon begin the fifth unit of Reading which is all about Manchester. If anyone has a relative who grew up in Manchester in the 1920's to the 1960's before Urban Renewal, and who would like to talk to the third grade about what Manchester was like during that time, please contact Ms. Brown or Mr. Sweetland. The third grade will be doing a walking tour around some of the historical sites in Manchester on May 3, and chaperones are very welcome!!!

In Math we will be continuing our fraction unit. We will be looking at fractions on the number line, improper fractions, and equivalent fractions.

## **FOURTH GRADE** Mrs. Godbout & Ms. Rivers

After a long stretch of working with nonfiction, fourth grade students are excited to be working with fiction this month. The children are reading historical fiction books in a "book club". Over the course of the unit the children will synthesize evolving settings with plot lines and subplots. They will also learn that historical stories unfold along two timelines: one timeline for historical events and another timeline for the protagonist's life. In math we continue to work with fractions and will introduce decimals. Once this work is done all we have left is measurement and then geometry. While we continue to move through various math topics our work with computation and problem solving is never done. After vacation you will be getting the details for two upcoming field trips.

Our trip to the Audubon Center in Glastonbury will be on May 16 and our trip to UCONN is TBD. Best wishes for a warm sunny April vacation!

## **FIFTH GRADE** Mrs. Adinolfi, Ms. Brahm & Mrs. Jodoin

Our big focus of this third semester will be the American Revolution. This theme will be threaded through all subject areas, with the reading of novels, watching of films, and with traveling back in time to Sturbridge Village on May 3, a living history museum.

With the time change and more opportunity to play outside, and with all the busy sports schedules of spring, the temptation is to slack off or rush through the homework. Please try to encourage your child to be diligent with their responsibilities. Homework planners always have the information parents need to know what is happening in school, and checking in every once in a while is a good idea.

Remember, we are all still working on Independent Reading. Students should be pacing themselves to read 20-30 minutes every day. If your child has "nothing to do", please hand him/her a favorite book. As Dr. Seuss said, "The more you read, the more you know. The more you know, the smarter you grow. The smarter you grow, the stronger your voice, when speaking your mind or making your choice." Read, read, read.

## ART Mrs. Maloney

It's beginning to feel like spring in the Art room! Kindergarten students finished their Very Hungry Caterpillars just in time for the celebration of the Very Hungry Caterpillar day on March 20th! We reviewed primary colors and experimented mixing them together. We painted six circles to make the body of our colorful caterpillars to celebrate the beginning of the spring season! In 1st grade, we have been creating a special "chicken" like we read about in the story "An Extraordinary Egg". We practice a lot of cutting and gluing skills while learning about patterns. Second graders have been creating their daffodil sculpture made from paper and learning about paper techniques to turn two-dimensional paper into three-dimensional sculpture. We also created our clay turtles. In third grade, we have started working on our insects in the garden. We draw our bugs carefully and then create close-up organic shapes around them that resemble shapes in a garden. We color our positive space and paint the negative space around them. Fourth graders just finished creating our figure in action collages. While they learned about the Charleston dance in Music and Physical Education, students created artwork in which we tried to create a feeling of rhythm and motion with our moving figures, bright colors and repetitive patterns. Fifth grade learned about "Perspective" as they tried to turn squares into cubes. Our study of "Perspective" will help us to draw our lighthouses in which we are trying to create the feeling of a three-dimensional form on a flat surface.

Research shows that the more children read, the better readers they become. Researchers have consistently found a strong relationship between the volume of students' reading and their reading achievement. According to several widely cited research studies:

- The best predictor of reading achievement is the amount of time children spend reading books on their own.
- There are few other ideas as widely accepted as that reading is learned through reading.
- The amount of time students spend in independent reading is the best predictor of the amount of gain in reading achievement in students.

Encouraging students to read is the most important thing we can do as parents and as educators. Thank you for helping to instill a love of reading and for supporting reading at home!
