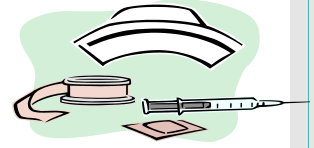
"We are very pleased to welcome Mr. Osunde to the administrative team. His experience as a guidance counselor in East psychology, and his

Q: Do I have to sign up for my flu shot?

A: No, just visit during any one of the scheduled clinic hours below:

Q: Who gets the flu shot at no charge?

A: All employees who are covered by Cigna insurance through Manchester Public Schools, must present a

membership card to receive the shot free of charge. The following groups do not pay per union contract: Secretaries, B&G and Nurses.

Q: I do not have Cigna health insurance. Do I have to pay for the flu shot?

A: Yes, you will need to pay \$25 cash or money order. Checks will not be accepted.
