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A Peek inside Room 22...



We planned then created an oven and microwave for our Dramatic Play Center “Bakery”. The children painted the boxes, then thought about what an oven/microwave looks like, and what we could add to our boxes that would look like that. They made burners out of paper plates and knobs out of pom poms with cut up paper towel tubes loose around the pom poms because they wanted them to be able to turn. They were excited to bake in the new additions to the center.



We read The Mitten by Jan Brett. The children helped to tell the story by holding various animals which were characters in the story. As each animal entered the snow white mitten in the story, the children brought their animal into our huge mitten in the middle of our circle.
