What's Happening In...

- **Reading:** We are working on noticing what avid readers do! Avid readers don't just read, they also think about what they are reading! We are using fictional texts to think about characters, setting, and plot, and to set goals for our reading.
- **Math:** We are working on teen numbers! We are thinking about teen numbers as 10 and some more, we are counting and building teen numbers, and we are writing number sentences to match! We continue to work on counting to 100 and fluency with addition and subtraction.
- **Writing:** We are working on writing how to books! We are continuing to work on stretching out words to write sounds. We will start our opinion writing unit soon, where we will write to make the world a better place!
- **Social Thinking:** We just finished learning the 3 steps of problem solving - breathe, think, do. We are learning about "thinking with our eyes" or using what we see to help us figure out what is expected.
